## **General Business:**

## Perth Orchid Fair 7-8 September 2024

Successful event both in attendance and plants sales. SOSWA will receive about \$720 covering refund of the \$300 seed funding, and \$420 share of profit from \$236 based on volunteer hours (well done members), and \$184 from plants sales commission, event entry and raffle. Helen advised that SOSWA was well represented with volunteers who accounted for about 20% of the total volunteer hours recorded.

The organising committee will meet later this month to review the event and plan for 2025. If you have any suggestions in this regard, please make them known to Ken.

We sold over \$10,600 worth of member's orchids. This is both our major source of revenue, and a very important attraction for members of the public to attend the event. So that we can continue to grow this event, please plan to divide and propagate your orchids for sale at next year's event.

Apparently, there is a video posted on U-Tube of the Perth Orchid Fair. If you have seen it, could you please let me have a URL so that I can copy it to members.

## September Home Visit

Thanks to Graham and Margaret and Adrian for the visit to Wireless Hill, Canning Highway, Booragoon to look at terrestrial orchids. The orchids were easily accessible and clearly identified with signage (both permanent and temporary).

## **MONTHLY PLANT**

## Ascocentrum ampullaceum

Country of origin: Mainland and Island SE Asia

**Description:** Small/miniature Vandaceous monopodial with attractive small pink/orange flowers

**Difficulty:** Suitable for shadehouse culture with summer humidity, good air movement and winter protection.

### Cost: \$15

This month's sale plant Ascocentrum ampullaceum [Lindley] Schlechter 1913 comes from central China, western Himalayas, Assam India, Bangladesh, eastern Himalayas, Nepal, Bhutan, Sikkim, Andaman Islands, Myanmar, Thailand, Laos and Vietnam where it can be found in subtropical forests near rivers. often on deciduous trees at 300 -1.500m. It is a miniature, hot to cool growing vandaceous epiphyte. Short, simple several leafed upright stems carry suberect leaves that are keeled on the underside and grooved on the top. Flowering in spring through summer takes place on a 8-20cm compact inflorescence with many small flowers.

Hot to cool temperatures, high humidity and bright light are required for this species. It also grows well in wood slat basket culture or on hardwood mounts, and prefers drying out and cooling during winter months, so should be protected from rain at this time

*Cycnoches warscewiczii* Rchb.f 1852 can be found from southern Nicaragua, Costa Rica and Panama to Colombia as a deciduous medium sized warm growing epiphyte on trees and rotten logs, and occasionally as a terrestrial beside rotten logs at 700 – 1,000meters. The 30cm pseudobulb carries 30-40cm leaves, and this species flowers in autumn as or after it sheds its leaves. Heavily scented 8cm flowers are carried on a pendant, racemose, several flowered inflorescence arising from the leaf nodes at the apex of the newest, mature, leafless pseudobulb. Its common name is Warscewicz's Cycnoches named for an 1800's Polish orchid collector.

#### Clowesia

*Clowesia* is a genus that is familiar to many of us, especially those who remember Tony Watkinson's award winning Clowesia russelliana that Mavis generously donated to the Species Society for a special raffle (I was lucky enough to win one of the two divisions raffled). Clowesia dodsoniana Aq. León 1986 comes from Mexico in the state of Michoacan as a medium sized, hot to warm growing epiphyte or occasional lithophyte in tropical forests at 100 – 600m. Ovoid-sub-conical elongate, sulcate pseudobulbs carry imbricate, distichous, elliptic, acuminate 3 veined leaves. The basal leaves are shorter, middle leaves longer and apical leaves longest.

Flowering in late spring through to mid-autumn takes place on 1-3, basal, lateral, pendent, racemose, 18 - 39cm racemes arising from a new pseudobulb, and each carrying 12 to 30 fragrant flowers with triangular bracts and lanceolate floral bracts. This species was our monthly

sales plant in April 2024 and was grown from flask by Bruce Larson, Its common name is Dodson's Clowesia named for a current American botanist and orchidologist.

## **Monthly Meetings**

Monthly meetings held on the second Tuesday of each month at Wilson Community Hall, Braibrise St, Wilson commencing 7.45 pm. Usually, the short formal meeting is followed by plant descriptions given by members. Supper follows to allow members time to socialise and discuss orchids. All visitors are very welcome

## **Membership Fees**

**Family** \$30 pa. For first year only, new family members will need to purchase two name badges. Badges come in two versions - pin fastening \$14.00 or magnet fastening \$16.00 [Please indicate preference]

**Single** \$20.00 pa. For first year only, new members will need to purchase a name badge. Badges come in two versions - pin fastening \$14.00 or magnet fastening \$16.00. [Please indicate preference]

New members who don't live in Perth will not require name badges, therefore membership cost will be at the renewal fee only

## **Monthly Home Visit**

On the weekend following the fourth Thursday of each month (generally on the Sunday morning), a home visit is held at a member's home. This gives members an opportunity to enjoy the fellowship that our mutual interest provides, and to see how others go about growing their orchids.

## **Monthly Plant Display**

Given that the prime objective of the Society is to promote the cultivation of species orchids, only species or natural hybrids are acceptable for display. Since we all may be uncertain about the identification of a plant from time to time, we encourage

members to bring plants along about which they are unsure since someone may be able to identify them. There is no competition nor restriction on flower count, quality or length of ownership. We want members to be able to see species plants in flower. So even if your flowers are a bit past their best, bring them in as others may not have seen that species in flower.

#### **Plant Sales**

The Society provides an opportunity table for members to sell surplus plants and equipment, and for the Society to sell product from time to time.

#### **Plant Purchases**

The Society endeavours to obtain a different species seedling for sale at each meeting, usually costing between \$6.00 and \$15.00. The Society makes a small profit on these sales which is invested in benefits to members. As it is always difficult to get new or different species, should members have 20 or more plants of one species which they feel might be suitable as a monthly plant, please contact a Committee member.

#### Raffle

The Society conducts a raffle each meeting and at home visits as a means of generating funds. If you have spare species orchids that you wish to sell to the Society for raffles, please advise a committee member.

#### Management

In accordance with the Rules, the Annual General meeting is held in May each year at which time the office-bearers and committee are elected. The majority of Committee members serve two year terms.
